



PASTOR'S PONDERING FOR APRIL 2024

Greetings to all my brother and sister saints. We have celebrated our last Easter together. Graduations are around the corner and Memorial Day will be here before you know it. That also means my time with you is coming rapidly to an end. This fact brings me to this month's pondering.

When I started the candidate process with the U. M. Conference, twenty-seven years ago, they required me to identify a "Life Verse." That meant one scripture verse that generally guided you at all times. (I thought it was odd, but whatever.) So, some of you know that my aunt had been a missionary in free China for thirty-six years. (When she started in the fifties, she would board a freighter from New York harbor, sail down the east coast, then through the Panama Canal, cross the Pacific Ocean to live in Taiwan, where she would stay for **five years** before coming home. Ladies, imagine being in your twenties and packing five years' worth of <u>everything</u> you would need. I was quite impressed with her, so I picked her favorite verse as my life verse. Her King James Bible highlights Joshua 1:9 "Have I not commanded thee? Be strong and of good courage; be not afraid, neither be thou dismayed: for the Lord thy God is with thee withersoever thou goest."



I kept that verse as a pastor until one day I came across the passage in 1st Kings when God offers Solomon anything he wants. Solomon asks for "a discerning heart to govern your people and to distinguish between right and wrong." I thought, well God, I certainly could use that, and so it became my "Life verse".

Well, now I am fully retiring. There won't be any people for me to even pretend that I'm governing. I had been praying about this and remembering the Joshua command about being courageous. I had just shared that issue with Barbara that morning, and in my prayer book that very

morning, this was the prayer by John S. Hoyland:

- We have seen so many positive things happening at Glossbrenner in the past few years. Two youth groups meet during the week. Over 30 children and youth participated in the Holy Thursday Celebration. We have three adult Sunday school classes where individuals are studying the Bible and becoming stronger disciples of Christ. We have an awesome music program that includes a Choir, a Bell Choir, and a Praise Band. We have opened our church to the community with events such as VBS, Fall Fest, Yard Sale, and Country Fair & Market. We are keeping the main thing, the main thing as we have been wandering in this Wilderness period together. We are now in a time of discernment and planning for Glossbrenner's future. Our hope is to be able to put together a vision and mission for Glossbrenner that we can put into action.
- The Mount Joy Community's Perspective of our church will fit into one of three categories:

Negative: The neighborhood knows who you are and would rather you not be there.

Neutral: The neighborhood does not know you or has no opinion about you.

Positive: The neighborhood knows who you are and is grateful to have you in the community.

 What impact can we make in the Mount Joy community? We will have several opportunities for the congregation to get involved in this planning phase.

Starting on April 14, we will start having monthly Tri-Church meet and greet sessions to continue the dialogue and make connections with members of Glossbrenner, Chiques, and Milton Grove that was started at the February 25th gathering. These meetings will be on Sunday from 3:00-4:00 at the Wallick-O'Connor House across from the Post Office. All will be welcome to attend these meetings. Please put this on your calendar and plan to participate.

There will be a Congregational Potluck Dinner on Saturday, April 27. Not only will there be delicious food, but everyone will be given an opportunity to have a voice as we continue in planning a mission and vision for our church. We want to have something in place for when Pastor Heather joins us so we can start implementing those plans. There will also be activities for the children. So come one, come all.

Remember that on the 2nd and 4th Tuesday of each month there is a Prayer Session that meets in the Chapel at 11:00 AM. It is a very powerful and uplifting time for individuals to open their hearts concerning family, friends, the church, our community, and our nation. If you are available during that time of the day, please consider joining the group. "Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." (Philippians 4:6-7)

- In our catechism class, we discussed that the purpose of our existence is to "love God and to enjoy him forever." We are the bearers of the image of God in the world. That means Glossbrenner needs to be a search-and-rescue ship, not a cruise ship. 
