


hearts and minds to answer honest questions about God, the Bible, and Christianity. Please consider joining our class as we fellowship, share prayer concerns, and dig deeper into

Glossbrenner Church Canoe Opportunity CANCELLED

Sadly, the canoe outing on Saturday, May 3rd had to be cancelled because only one person signed up to take part in the

event. Dave Eichler has been working



diligently to provide opportunities to enjoy the great outdoors, but has had to cancel because either lack of interest, scheduling conflicts, or not knowing of the opportunity. He put great effort into filling out an application for a grant from the PA Fish & Boat Commission to obtain canoes, trailers, and equipment. We received 100% of the grant money - \$20,658.89. Of the 30 applicants; 19 were accepted and Glossbrenner was the only one that received 100% of the grant. The grant stipulations require reimbursement, not a forwarded funding situation. For the PFBC 2024 R3 grant, 25% of the requested grant amount must be submitted by June 30, 2025. Sixteen percent was acquired with outings last fall. Dave was hoping to complete the remaining 9% with outings this spring. He has 2 groups scheduled for outings in June. Hopefully, they will not cancel and he can acquire some of the 9% needed to fulfill the grant match. If there is another canoe outing scheduled for Glossbrenner folks, please consider supporting the opportunity to enjoy God's great outdoors!

UPDATE ON DISAFFILIATION

Glossbrenner is one of 50 churches from the EPA Conference that have been in the process of disaffiliation from the United Methodist Denomination since June 2022. We are now very close to our journey in the wilderness to be over. The River Jordan is in our sights and we are close to that time when we can cross it. Here is a list of events that have happened recently.

• December 2024: The EPA Conference submitted a 2,455 page response appealing to dismiss the case.

• January 2025: Our attorneys, National Council of Life and Liberty (NCLL) is given a 30 day extension to reply to the Conference's appeal.

• March 7 2025: The court ruled in part in our favor. Of the three counts against the Conference, the Breach of Contract and Promissory Estoppel arguments get to go forward to a trial.

• April 10, 2025: The Conference asked the judge to reconsider the issue. The judge denied it. If there is no settlement offered by the Conference, the next step will be to set a trial date.

The Transition Leadership Team will continue to keep the congregation informed of any new developments. In the meantime, please continue to pray for Glossbrenner Church, our staff, the EPA Conference, Judge Jeffrey Saltz, and the attorneys involved in this process.

SHEPHERDS CORNER

I came across the following when preparing for the Shepherd Ministries meeting last month. It is based on John 10:1-16, where Jesus tells the Pharisees about The Good Shepherd and His Sheep. In this passage, Jesus lays down what it means to be a good leader. We can all apply the following to our lives and our relationships with others.

Eight Qualities of Shepherd Leaders by John B. MacDonald

These are a few qualities we can learn from the good shepherd to become better leaders.

 Boundaries: A true leader will establish and maintain boundaries for the benefit of themselves and those they lead.

• Example: A true leader leads by example. It is not a case of "do as I say, not as I do." True leaders must be worthy models to follow.

• Trustworthy: A leader needs to cultivate a

deep sense of trust with those he or she leads. • Provision: True leaders provide for the genuine needs of those they lead.

• Sacrificial: Shepherds willingly experience personal sacrifice for the benefit of those they lead. It is not about the leader; it's about those being led.

• Invested: The shepherd is personally invested in the sheep and sticks with them through thick and thin.

• Relational: The true leader takes the time and energy to build solid and genuine relationships with those he or she leads. Each is known and treated as an "image of God."

• Visionary: True leaders have a clear, Godhonoring vision for the future and live toward it. "Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility values others above yourself,

not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interest of others." ~ Philippians 2:3-4 Mark Rorabaugh, Shepherd Ministries Chair




