

They were married at Glossbrenner on May 6, 1956 and have 3 daughters, Patricia Peifer, Barbara Peifer, and Cindy Peifer Kamide; and three grandchildren, Andrew Davidson, and Molly and Ben Kamide. Safe Sanctuaries

Why does Glossbrenner Church have a Safe Sanctuary Policy? The primary goal is to ensure we provide a safe and welcoming place for children, youth and vulnerable adults to grow in their faith without fear or worry. We also want to maintain a high level of accountability to protect our volunteers and staff from false allegations of abuse, neglect or misconduct in all church-related activities, on-site and off. The policy is necessary to meet the requirements of our insurers, our Conference, and the State of Pennsylvania.

How do we do this? The key components include screening procedures, the two-adult rule, visibility, age/relationship gap, training and education, and reporting protocol.

Screening consists of obtaining background checks and reference checks for all staff and volunteers who work with children, youth or vulnerable adults. Background checks and applications are required every five years.

The two-adult rule: A minimum of two non-related, screened adults should always be present.

Visibility: Classroom doors should have windows, or doors should stay open, to ensure activities are in plain view.

Age/Relationship Gap: Volunteers supervising minors should be at least 18 years old and at least 5 years older than the children/youth they are supervising.

Training & Education: Annual training or review is mandatory for staff and volunteers to recognize the signs of abuse and understand reporting procedures.

Reporting Protocol: A clear, documented procedure for reporting suspected abuse to local authorities and church leadership.

What if I am just helping once? People helping for VBS or people who are volunteering for an activity for which there are already two people who have full clearances do not need to have full clearance. If you are one of two people leading a Sunday school class or working in the nursery, you both need to have full clearance. You can discuss any questions you have about whether you need clearance with Jess Rockey, Pastor Heather or Cindy Forry.

Why do I need training? What if I already have training through my health care or school employment? The key need for training is to become more aware of the signs of abuse, the church's policy, and the church's reporting protocol. Why can't I volunteer with my husband or sister? If you prefer to do so, you need to be sure to keep the door open. You also need to be aware that you then are more at risk of potential false accusations. You may want to consider having a third person assist in the classroom.

If you are interested in volunteering, see Pastor Heather or Jess Rockey. If you are already volunteering, Cindy Forry will let you know when any of your required clearances will expire or have expired.

Let's focus on the main thing: We have a responsibility to our children, youth and vulnerable adults to ensure that Glossbrenner Church is a safe place where they can experience the abiding love of God within the welcoming fellowship of our congregation.

A Deeper Walk: Marcus Warner

Traditional discipleship falls short of offering us solutions we need to handle heart-level issues. The process usually looks like this: You start attending a church and after a while, someone asks you to volunteer. If you are faithful as a volunteer, you are soon asked to lead. If you are faithful as a leader, you can find yourself in the inner circle of power in that church without ever being discipled.

The Christian life is not just about thinking deep thoughts or even thinking correctly. There is something deeper going on inside the heart that academics doesn't touch. The church doesn't exist just to make disciples. We exist as in Paul's vision to "reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God and become **mature**, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ." (Eph. 4:13) In other words, the goal of the discipleship process is to produce mature disciples.

Spiritual maturity cannot be separated from emotional and relational maturity. Let's use the fruit of the Spirit as a measuring stick of how we know someone is mature.

Love: That's about as relational as it gets.

Joy: Joy determines our capacity to handle upsetting emotions.

Peace: Peace is a good description of being quieted from distressing emotions.

Patience: It is the core of relational maturity. One can define maturity as the ability to suffer well.

Maturity is the ability to remain relational, act like yourself, and return to joy despite upsetting emotions. Scripture talks about maturity in terms of spiritual infants, children, adults, parents, and elders.

Infants: Infants cannot take care of themselves. In the spiritual sense, we are infants when we lose our ability to stay relational and need someone else to help us recover, or we get stuck in our distress for a long time. (1 Corinthians 3:1-2)

Children: Spiritual children are good at making sure their needs get met, but are not good at making sure the needs of others around them are met.

Adults: Spiritual adults are emotionally stable and good with relationships. They can also focus on the needs of others. (Philippians 2:3-4)

Parents: Model adult-level maturity and are ready to start training a new generation in the skills and habits of maturity. (1 Corinthians 4:15-17)

Elders: Elders have raised their own children and are available to care for the community. They are well practiced in helping others fill holes in their maturity level.

If the goal of the Christian faith is to learn to love God and others, it makes sense that our discipleship process should not simply be about academics, good behavior, and church activity. It should be anchored in a growth model that helps us become more loving people, who stay loving people even when life gets hard. There is a reason God wanted so many elders in the world. He knew we would need help navigating the hardships of a fallen world.

Prayer
 Start your day in prayer. If you don't know where to start, consider the **ACTS** prayer.

- Adoration:** Praise God for who he is.
- Confession:** Admit where you have sinned or need God's help in a situation.
- Thanksgiving:** Thank the Lord for his provision and goodness in your life.
- Supplication:** Ask God to meet specific needs in your life and in the lives of those you know.






